21/042.1 None

#### 21/043 MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 05 OCTOBER 2021

21/043.1 RESOLVED – that the minutes of the meeting be approved as a true and correct record.

## 21/044 CHESHIRE RESILIENCE PLAN

21/044.1 Two representatives from the Cheshire Unitary authorities attended the meeting to discuss the development of Resilience Plans. Councillors expressed concern that they have produced reports relating to problems in the village caused by flooding and highways issues but these had achieved nothing owing to the lack of engagement from the responsible authorities. The representatives agreed to discuss these issues with the appropriate Council officers and feedback.

## 21/045 PUBLIC SPEAKING

21/045.1 A member of the public referred to problems with the increase in traffic on the bridge over the River Weaver on Cross Lane. There had been increased incidences of road rage and road safety issues for pedestrians and cyclists. A number of options to improve the situation were proposed such as traffic lights on the bridge, a weight limit and replacing the roundabout with a T-junction.

## 21/046 CO-OPTION

21/046.1 The Clerk advised that there had been no requests for co-option onto the Council to fill the existing vacancy. It was noted that there was no time limit on filling the vacancy therefore this would remain open.

# 21/047 BOROUGH COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

21/047.1 Borough Cllr Pochin submitted a written report which outlined actions relating to a damaged manhole cover, clearance of Eel brook and Delphic depot.

#### 21/048 FLOODING/HIGHWAYS

- 21/048.1 Councillors once again expressed frustration at the lack of progress despite all of the efforts made to date. The Chairman advised that he would contact the journalist that undertook the recent article to try and publicise the issues and lack of progress from Cheshire East and other authorities. It was suggested that all Parish Councils along the River Weaver should be contacted to discuss the issues further.
- 21/048.2 It was suggested that an Fol request be submitted to Cheshire East Council to ascertain the outcome of any bridge surveys undertaken in the area.

With regards Delphic Transport, contact with the North West Traffic Office was suggested to ascertain whether they were operating within their licence conditions.

## 21/049 VILLAGE HALL REDEVELOPMENT

21/049.1 Cllr Boote advised that Cheshire East Council were not currently undertaking pre-application discussions therefore this would require the planning application to be designed and submitted before any feedback would be received from the planning authority.

## 21/050 WILDLIFE AREA

21/050.1 Councillors discussed the offer of trees from e-forest.co.uk. It was noted that the minimum order was 150 trees and they had to be placed on land accessible to the public. It was agreed that these conditions would make this unsuitable for local needs.
