7. Broadband:

The possible start date of 3 March has now been moved to the end of June, and the end of August for phase two.

(General information - there should be no impact on infrastructure. Everybody will be aware when up and running. They might be a slight increase in cost, but this will be discussed further when nearer phase two. Possibilities of a deal with a new provider if the numbers of interested parties are sufficient).

8. Update from other groups:

Village Hall -

AGM held with the Village Hall only breaking even on costs.

Very keen to promote it further. HUB to be actively taken forward. What do we want for the future? - Broadband, Education and Culture. Three small committees muted:- Theatre Productions, Broadband & IT, What needs to be done to the Village Hall?

Planning already agreed for storage at the back and also for putting another room at the front. Costs-Building a shell £25k. WREN for finishing. Car park to be redone with more space. Funding application already submitted two years ago but this was not successful. Application now needs to be planned more carefully and needs to fulfil benefits to the community and sustainability. Architects plan and costing done by SW and CS.

SW has agreed to chair the HUB overall but with the help of volunteers for:-Computers (Broadband and IT) and costing.

Theatre and Culture and costing.

Promoting the Village Hall - possibility of showing films in the Winter months that have been in the cinema but not yet on CD - website 'flickin the sticks' - approximate cost £108 (including licence) to put on.

www.villagevending.com - shop fitted outside (similar to a vending machine) and looked after by residents. Possible sites the Village Hall or the Badger Car Park. UTA (University of the Third Age) are always looking for new groups and space to use and there would be a possibility of promoting Village Hall during the daytime and evenings.

Unfortunately, promoting the Village Hall is on hold at the moment as the storage space is unsafe.

PCC -

AGM held. Very successful Plant sale. Final monies in place for the church roof. (£40k). Work to start in July (£4k from HCCPT). Costs increased as pitch on the roof has to be greater which increased costs by £10k. Fund raising needs to continue.

Next iniative to be discussed with PCC is the lay out of the Church, mainly with the introduction of 'Messy Church'.

New Vicar Ann Lawson has started. All four parishes are now working together even though four separate parishes.

PC -

AGM Monday 19 May. Very busy over the last six months with Traffic calming measures, which is almost complete. PC now on a sounder financial footing. The extraction of fumes from the Badger has been raised with residents in the core of the village. Now been raised with Michael Jones. Cheshire East now forcing the issue with the Schofields as it has to be done.

Two planning applications have been received and both approved:-Beech House Bridge House Cottage

Events group -

Three shows have taken place in the Village Hall. Two Cheshire Rural Touring events and one in a bus. Profits made from Cape Rath but unfortunately a loss was made on the children's Blast Off. Becky Freeman wanted to trial a children's show and school visits were supposed to happen to promote this. This did not happen and feedback is to be given to CRT. Perhaps more funding could be offered as an incentive for us to promote children's shows in future. 2014 is the first full calendar of events. No doubt some will work and some will not.

Events growing strongly.

9. Pathways and Environment group:-Canal and Rivers Trust

Moving ahead with the adoption of canal between bridge 11 to 15. Meeting on Saturday 17 May for a litter pick and stroll to see what can be done, (volunteers M Guy, A Guy, D Wallis, A R Taylor, L Baddiley, A Baddiley, M Carrs). Vista point with a possibility of a bench. Planting bulbs to embellish this project.
